



Spiritual Healing: Attunement

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From what has already been considered it will be clear that the function of the healing medium is to act as an intermediary between the spirit healing forces and the patient.

The healing mediums are not active therapists; they are passive instruments. The requisite for healership is, therefore, for the medium to cultivate the art of attunement.

First and last, a healer must know how to attune to spirit, for the greater the conscious blending they can establish with the healing intelligence, the greater will be the flow of healing power through them.

This “tuning in process” involves a mental withdrawal from earthly things so that the lower part of the mind is inactive, the consciousness being switched to the higher level which reaches out to contact and become receptive to the great infinite resources of spirit. Whether the healer links with a particular healing guide, or with the healing intelligence itself, does not matter.

The quality and character of the healing forces, and how they are actually administered to the patient, is beyond the comprehension of the healing medium. This is the concern and responsibility of the healer(s) in spirit, and the whole process may safely be left entirely to them.

The medium’s hands are frequently used in the actual act of healing to convey the healing energies to the sufferer’s affected part. The medium is confident that their spirit guide is channelling the healing power through them. The medium mentally directs the flow of the healing energies through their hands, which become the output, or transmitting terminals, of the medium’s etheric body. The etheric body is acting as a transformer for the healing power.

Learn to trust in all we cannot see and hear with the physical senses, for the power of healing is not of this world, it comes from the universal light whom we call God.

The natural laws which govern life are perfect and inflexible; they cannot be cancelled, set aside, or suspended to suit the faith of any individual. It is because these very laws have been infringed upon that disease exists, and until the sufferer has earned the right to be healed, no amount of willpower or faith will heal them. When the time is ripe the sufferer will be healed, but not before, and regardless of their faith.

As a natural corollary, therefore, we can add that it is NOT a patient's lack of faith which prevents a healing from taking place.
